You're Invited to the Reception & Lecture for LAVC Art Gallery "Cultural Windows" Exhibition

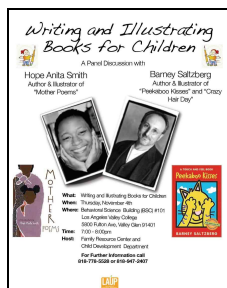
The LAVC Art Gallery, and Arts Council will hold a reception and lecture for its latest exhibition entitled "Cultural Windows: the Art of Ruth Asawa, Ynez Johnston and Betye Saar" on Tuesday, November 2. The reception will begin at 7 p.m. in the LAVC Art Gallery, followed by an 8 p.m. lecture by Karin Higa, adjunct senior curator of Art at the Japanese American National Museum in Los Angeles. The exhibition features approximately 50 works including sculpture, painting, drawings, prints and ceramics by artists Ruth Asawa, Ynez Johnston and Betye Saar. The cultural references that appear in their work have been derived from personal heritage, ancestry, domestic and foreign cultures, or subcultures that reveal a rich cultural synthesis.
