Job Training Program Receives \$600,000 HUD Grant

The LAVC Job Training Program received a \$600,000 three-year grant by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Office of Community Partnerships to provide financial literacy training for low- and moderate-income residents in the San Fernando Valley. The grant will allow for LAVC to offer non-credit adult financial literacy courses, in partnership with Junior Achievement, at Junior Achievement's new Finance Park. In addition, the college will have a presence at the training location with a LAVC kiosk as the resident institution of higher education.



Student Services Receives a \$1 Million Grant for Upward Bound

LAVC Student Services received a \$1 Million Grant from the U.S. Department of Education. The college will get \$250,000 per year for four years to establish an Upward Bound presence at Grant and Van Nuys

High Schools. The Upward Bound program encourages at-risk 9th to 12th grade students who do not want to pursue secondary education to go onto college. Students who participate in the program receive monthly stipends, tutoring, free Saturday and afterschool classes, educational field trips and attend cultural events. In addition, the LAVC MEChA members will serve as mentors to the students in the program.



LAVC Receives \$2.8 Million Grant from the Department of Education

LAVC received a \$2.8 million grant, over a five-year period, from the U.S. Department of Education to expand the distance education program. The grant will fund an expansion of its current online and hybrid instruction, including the delivery of online AA degrees and online/hybrid prerequisites in nursing. In addition, the grant will also provide funding for scholarships, a laptop loan program, and an online student portal for emailing, chatting, accessing academic records and obtaining online academic counseling. HHLPS Professor David Brown Receives Award at State Conference

David Brown, who teaches political science and history in the HHLPS department, received a Distinguished Leadership Award – Citizen Planner/Layperson Award by the California Chapter of the American Planning Association (APA) on October 2 at the APA state convention in San Jose. David is also a commissioner with the City of Calabasas's Planning Commission. This state award will enable him to be the California nominee in the "Award of Distinguished Leadership for a Planning Advocate" at the national level.



Former LAVC student wins an Emmy

Cinema Arts alum Steve Silver was recently awarded an Emmy for Outstanding Cinematography for a Multi-Camera Series for his work on CBS' hit TV show "Two and a Half Men". Since leaving LAVC in the mid-1980s, Steve has worked in both film and TV, single and multi-camera, including the new digital HD formats. He contacted his former mentor Joe Daccurso, a Media Arts professor, to say he owes much of his success to the film education he received at LAVC, where he took his first filmmaking classes and pursued the occupational certificate program that lead him directly into the industry.
